MATERIALS LIST (2 pages)

* Tubes of traditional gouache paint in primary colors, plus a dark brown, dark blue and white. Both Winsor & Newton and Holbein are great. Student grade gouache is also totally fine. I'll provide some fun, additional colors. (NOTE: "Acryla," or acrylic gouache is an acrylic version of gouache which can work for this class but contains plastic, so I tend to avoid it.)

Recommended gouache brands:

- ** Alternatively, purchase this cheaper set of 12. The only thing about this set is the tubes are a bit smaller, so it might be good to get 2 (they're about \$12 per set)

- * 1 tube Rose: Holbein Rose (Opera can also be fun, a fluorescent)
- * 1-2 tubes red: *Primary Red* (Alizarin Crimson can be a nice addition)
- * 1 tube bright, light Yellow: Lemon Yellow or Primary Yellow
- * 1 tube deep yellow: Permanent Yellow Deep
- * 1 tube primary blue: Primary Blue (CMYK) / Primary Cyan (or Cerulean)
- * 1 tube deep blue: Ultramarine
- * 1 tube dark brown: Burnt Umber
- * 1 tube dark deep blue: Prussian Blue
- * 1 large tube Permanent White
- * a drawing or regular pencil or two, 2B, plus eraser + pencil sharpener
- * at least 3 watercolor brushes, two or more #8 or ½ inch FLAT, and one 1" FLAT minimum.

A Note About Brushes: You only need FLAT brushes made for water-based media for this class, i.e. you don't need other fancy shapes. To keep costs down I only ask that you get a few brushes, but it can be helpful to have several of both the ¼ and 1" size (again with a flat shape) listed below because we often mix several colors at once.

Brush 1 - #8 flat (at least two, more can be helpful)

Brush 2 - 3/4 " or 1" flat (one is needed, two to three are ideal)

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* from the house: ceramic plates for paint mixing (white ONLY. Sometimes I find these at a thrift store.)

* small paper cutting scissors
